



Conceptualizing sex and gender

"Gender -a sociocultural process- refers to the cultural and social attitudes that together shape and sanction 'feminine' and 'masculine' behaviors, products, technologies, environments, and knowledge" (Gendered innovation. Schiebinger & Klinge, 2013:9).

Throughout the research process:

- phases ranging from the formation of teams and
- decisions regarding the leadership of the project
- methodologies
- type of participation of men and women in all phases of the project (Yellow Window, 2009: 1.2).

For achieving scientific and technological excellence As part of the axis of responsible science and innovation (RRI, 2012: 3)

> A broader definition of gender includes power relations as constitutive of the process of gendered distinction (Scott, 1986: 1067), and sexuality as part of the construction of the sex-gender system of society (Rubin, 1986 [1975]: 114).







A reductionist definition of gender, regarding men and women as separate and homogeneous


Intersectionality does not appear

Workshop Gender sensitive research

"Today I learned that the people who is an expert on gender issues should spend more time researching to help other researchers to incorporate this dimension in research and go beyond general comments ... Taking into account. We need to think about how to help these research areas is not obvious how to integrate gender there" (participant workshop)

"These workshops are really helpful. I think that is what they are especially useful because they contact researchers from different areas, but I think there is a need to follow. What some people really need is to have someone sitting next to see what their research topic and how you can include a gender perspective" (participant workshop)
